

A 1966 Volvo F1800S

Irv Gordon held the Guinness World Record holder for most miles driven by a single owner of a non-commercial vehicle. At the time of his passing, he had driven 3.2 million miles, 5149900,8 kilometres. on his 1966 Volvo P1800S. He purchased the vehicle new in 1966 for \$4150. He had a 125-mile daily commute, and his advice was to have a proper routine maintenance schedule.

Gordon proved that if you develop a good maintenance schedule and stay informed, you can keep your car going for a long time. Preventative maintenance and high-quality components will always be cheaper than a breakdown.



Cars & Motorbikes Stars of the Golden Era

<u>SAVVA Technical Tip 181 – Battery Life</u>

One often hears the complaint – batteries aren't what they used to be - absolutely true, but it's not because modern batteries are poorer in quality, but because modern car batteries have a different requirement to our earlier car batteries.

The problems we have with our older cars using modern batteries is because our cars are not used regularly enough and the batteries are allowed to lose charge resulting in under-voltage and a shortened life.

Let's look at a modern car's requirement — firstly, and perhaps most importantly, they are in regular use. They have starter motors that can swing high compression engines at an alarming rate and they must also cater for electric windows, air conditioning, computers, powerful quartz and halogen lights plus numerous other electronic this and that's. Once the engine has started the alternator takes over and produces in excess of 40 amps to recharge the battery - even at low revs the battery is usually fully recharged within a few kilometers.

Older cars by comparison, once started, only require a few amps for the coil to keep them mobile, and another few amps to re-charge the battery. The poor old generator probably generates no more than 10 to 30 amps at a good 30 mph - which is about all the old generator can manage. The voltage and current regulation on generators is very speed dependent, which means the generator is only effective at higher engine revolutions. The usual monthly trip to the club and back a few kilos away equals poor battery life and most of the time a half-charged battery.

Basically, modern batteries are excellent for the purpose they are made and last years – BUT, they are not designed to stand around unused in old cars and if they stand discharged for any length of time they may not recharge to their original voltage.

If we are to use modern batteries, we should use a "smart charger" the price of good ones has come down dramatically and they are now affordable. In fact, half the price of a new battery.

The picture is of an inexpensive Optimate battery maintenance charger. This model maintains the battery at 12.8 volts even while the car is not being used.

NOTE! Beware of "El Cheapo" chargers that are flooding the market. Just remember – goed koop is deur koop!



Did you know.....

.....that Jay Leno owns a 1965 Honda S600 Convertible.



At full throttle near the stratospheric redline, the tiny twin pipes at the back of the Honda S600 emit a sound that few other cars can match. Though it sports all the visual cues of a 1965 model, the title—and the tag—say it's a 1964.

Although the economy-focused N600 was one of the first Honda automobiles to go on sale in the United States, the Japanese company made a name for itself with another small car, this time a roadster: the S600.

Essentially an updated version of the S500 and earlier S360, the S600 was powered by a 600cc inline-four good for over 50 horsepower and capable of a relatively unheard-of-at-the-time 8500 rpm redline.

From humble beginnings making motorbikes in the immediate postwar years, by 1959 Honda was the largest motorcycle manufacturer in the world. Having always had an interest in automobiles, Soichiro Honda made his first four-wheeled transport in 1963 - the T360 small truck. His first big splash in the automotive world came a year later with the launch of the fascinating, minute S600 sports car that utilized engineering gained from motorcycle manufacture. By the early 1970s the Honda name became synonymous with zippy, reliable and fun small and micro cars.

In the 1980s Honda engines would dominate Formula One as they became world leaders in engine technology with V-TEC, Honda's patented variable valve timing. In between - they made several memorable cars that we still remember fondly. From the S600 sports car to the N600 micro car, the brilliant Civic, Accord, Integra, Prelude, and CRX pocket rocket to the magnificent NSX supercar. By the 1990s Honda had established themselves as a prestige brand worthy of standing alongside rivals from Europe.

Cars and motorcycles will compete on an even footing, over the same course and, for the most part, for the same trophies and awards. Details of all the awards can be found in the Supplementary regulations which are enclosed with this invitation.

The following is a brief timetable for the event:

Sunday 5th Nov.: Competitor registration, Documentation and Scrutiny for entrants from 13h00 to 17h00.

Competitors meeting time to be advised in the final instructions.

Monday 6th Nov.: Start the Competitive event (Day 1) from Goudini Spa.

Start times and numbers will be advised in the final instructions.

First day results will be posted at a time and place to be advised in the final instructions.

Tuesday 7th Nov.: Start of the Competitive event (Day 2) from Goudini Spa.

Start times to be advised in the final instructions.

The 36th Prize Giving Dinner and posting of final overall results at a time and venue to be advised.

Wednesday 8th Nov.: Departure of participants from Goudini Spa.

Entries are now open. In order to ensure a smooth flow of documentation, we draw your attention to the following:

ENTRY FORMS MUST BE COMPLETED IN FULL AND E-MAILED TO REACH US BY THE CLOSING DATE OF 22nd October 2023.

- 1. The original of all required documents such as Drivers Licenses, Vehicle Insurance, Indemnity and Club Membership cards must be produced at documentation. (Note well: proof of Vehicle Insurance is now required)
- 2. Confirmation of the dating of your vehicle by SAVVA must be available. If you are not in possession of a dating plaque or certificate, a letter from SAVVA confirming the date of manufacture is required. Letters from individual Clubs are not acceptable.
- 3. All monies due per the Financial/Accommodation form must reach the organizers by the closing date of 22nd October 2023.
- 4. Please note the request on the entry form for your medical aid and next-of-kin information. We do not wish to alarm entrants but this information will be of vital importance should it ever be required.

The course will traverse some very beautiful and interesting areas of the Western Cape and will include several mountain passes which only the Western Cape can provide.

The same types of accommodation, as in the past, will again be available including Slanghoek luxury Villas. The Rondawels will all be in the same general area as before. These groups are in reasonable proximity to each other with the Slanghoek Villas being slightly further afield. The Rondawels have been upgraded and can sleep a maximum of 5 persons. Each unit has 2 x Bedrooms one with a double bed and the other with 2 single beds.

(There is a sleeper couch Lounge/Dining area.) Upgraded Badsberg Flats are also available.

The Slanghoek Villas can sleep a maximum of six persons in three separate rooms, one of which has a double bed, and provide a distinct Lounge and Dining area as well as a built-in braai facility.

O D INGGS MEMORIAL RUN & FUN DAY March 2024

The OD Inggs Memorial Run has not been held for the last three years, the Albany Vintage and Classic Motor Club would like to revive the event and has proposed staging it over the weekend of 16/17 March 2024. However before proceeding with final planning, AVCMC would like to gauge the interest of prospective participants. Please complete the accompanying form as requested in the last paragraph of this letter.

Breaking with the traditional format of the event in the hope of attracting more people to vintage and classic motor vehicle events, we have decided to change the format into two distinct one-day events, the Saturday event will be the OD INGGS MEMORIAL RUN held on traditional lines while the Sunday event will be a fun event. Participants are most welcome, indeed encouraged, to take part in both events.

Saturday's Event:

The format for the Saturday will remain exactly the same as past regularity events with the usual rules and will commence at 09h30 from Rosehill Mall and cover a distance of about 350 km. An evening function and dinner followed by a prize giving that will be held at the AVCMC clubhouse. This function and the lunch and tea are covered by the entry fee. Cars and motorcycles manufactured before 31st December 1986 are eligible to compete and entry fees are R600.00 per vehicle which includes the driver and navigator. Additional passengers will be charged at a rate of R250 each if they require all the meals. Breakfast is available at various venues within the mall at the starting point but will be at participant's own cost.

All drivers and navigators must be current members of recognised clubs and hold valid SAVVA indemnities and vehicles must be covered by Third Party Insurance. Entrants must provide proof of the foregoing to the scrutineers before the event. The attention of entrants is drawn to the SAVVA safety requirements. A mounting bracket must be provided on the front of the vehicle to hold the numbered disc that will be provided.

This being a one-day event does mean that those entering from other clubs may return home the same day if they do not wish to take part in the fun event on the Sunday. However, all are encouraged to stay over, and a list of popular B&B's is available on request.

Sunday's Event:

The Sunday event has been designed as a fun event with the expectation of attracting more participants, it will commence at 09h30 at Rosehill and will end around 12h30 covering a distance of about 120 km. Breakfast is available at various venues within the mall at the starting point but will be at participant's own cost. The event will be followed by a small prize giving and a barbecue where participants are expected to provide their own food and refreshments. However, a braai pack could be ordered in advance through our club. Braai facilities will be provided. The event will include some elements of a regularity run but will also have a wider element of observational skills. Speedometers will not be covered up. Cars and motorcycles of any age are eligible to take part. There will be no entry fee for members of clubs affiliated to SAVVA.

All vehicles must be covered by Third Party Insurance and entrants must provide proof thereof to the scrutineers before each event.

The OD INGGS Memorial Run has been a popular and well supported event for many years, and we hope to have an equally successful event in 2024. As organising an event requires many days of detailed planning and expense, we must have an honest indication of those who would seriously consider participating on one or both days and therefore request interested persons to complete the attached form and email it to club@avcmc.co.za before 15 June 2023.
